5a. The specific purpose of this corporation is to: (a) to improve communications between representatives of labor and management; (b) to provide workers and employers with opportunities to study and explore new and innovative joint approaches to achieving organizational effectiveness; (c) to assist workers and employers in solving problems of mutual concern not susceptible to resolution within the collective bargaining process; (d) to study and explore new ways of eliminating potential problems which reduce the competitiveness and inhibit the economic development of the utility industry; (e) to sponsor programs which improve job security, enhance economic and community development, and promote the general welfare of the community and the industry; (f) to enhance the involvement of workers in making decisions that affect their working lives; (g) to expand and improve working relationships between workers and managers; and (h) to engage in any other lawful activities incidental or related to the accomplishment of these purposes and goals, all as may qualify it as an organization described in section 501(c)(6) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (hereinafter referred to as the "Code") and exempt it from federal income tax under section 501(a) of the Code, or the corresponding provisions of any future United States internal revenue law. The Corporation shall perform other acts as may be considered necessary or beneficial and shall have all powers specified for nonstock and nonprofit corporations generally under the laws of the State of California, as limited, however, by the purposes stated above.
